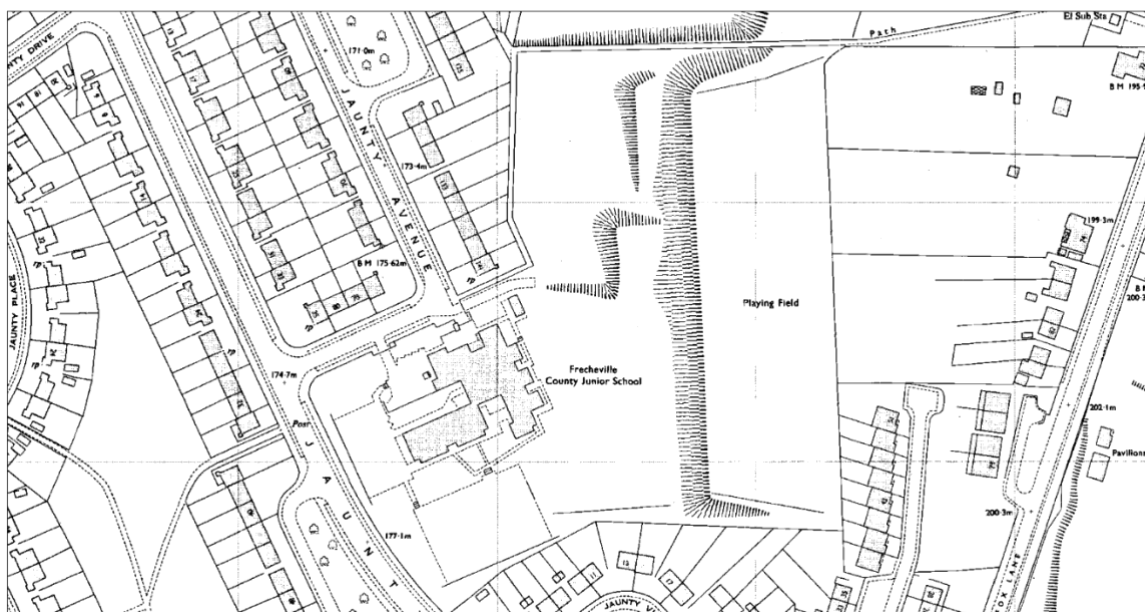


Sheffield Plan Examination Note

Status of site allocation SES13

1. *This note has been prepared in response to the Inspectors' request in EXAM217C (paragraph 23) to confirm the position on SES13, following confirmation that the site was formerly a school playing field. This note provides background evidence on the status of SES13.*
2. Sheffield City Council as landowner, have confirmed to the Local Planning Authority, that site SES13 is part of the former school playing fields of Frecheville County Junior School.
3. The historic plans (see below) and historic address records held in Sheffield City Council digital Ordnance Survey mapping system and database, confirm the institution historically located on Jaunty Avenue and Jaunty Road was officially known as Frecheville County Junior School.

4. The school remained operational until at least the mid to late 1980s. The school was subsequently closed and demolished as part of a programme of school consolidations undertaken by Sheffield City Council in the S12 area. The former school buildings at Frecheville County Junior School have been replaced by a housing development, completed by 1999.

5. The *Integrated Impact Assessment: Sustainability Appraisal* note to respond to *Examination queries and Further Main Modifications* considers the impact of this change and concludes no significant effect.
6. To comply with paragraph 99 of the National Planning Policy Framework 2023 in relation to sports pitches, the Council have proposed a further main modification (FMM32), which acknowledges the land is former school playing fields. FMM32 is set out in the *Schedule of Proposed Further Main Modifications* document and included below:

“The loss of sports pitch provision resulting from the proposed development should be replaced by equivalent or better provision in terms of quantity and quality in a suitable location taking account of the evidence set out in the Playing Pitch Strategy and priority projects for sports provision in the city.”
